ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971—SECTION 210

*Fylde Borough Council (Church Street to Wyre Avenue
Kirkham) Public Path Diversion Order 1977*

Notice is hereby given that on the 22nd June 1977 the Fylde Borough Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way running from a point marked AB in Church Street, Kirkham, to a point marked EF in Wyre Avenue, Kirkham and shown by a bold black line on the plan, marked "A" annexed to the Order to a line running from a point marked CD in Church Street, Kirkham, to a point marked IJ in Wyre Avenue, Kirkham and shown by bold black dashes on the plan marked "B" annexed to the Order.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the plans contained in it has been deposited at the Council Offices, Derby Road, Wesham and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

EAST HAMPSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACTS, 1971-74

Notice is hereby given that, on the 14th June 1977 East Hampshire District Council being the District Planning Authority, designated Conservation Areas at Chalton and Selborne, Hampshire under section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971.

These Conservation Areas are:—

- (1) an area in the centre of the village of Chalton including the Church, Manor Farm and the Red Lion Public House; and
- (2) an area in the village of Selborne including the Medieval Fishponds in Gracious Street and the remainder of the Valley to the north of the village including the Short Lythe to extend the existing Conservation Area.

The effect of designation is that special attention shall be paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the areas designated. In particular, controls are applied:

- (1) to require, except for certain specified exemptions, the prior consent of the District Planning Authority, or the Secretary of State for the Environment, to the whole or partial demolition of any building; and
- (2) to protect all trees within Conservation Areas from any act which would be prohibited by a Tree Preservation Order.

Penalties are applied for violation of these controls.

The designated Conservation Areas are defined on plans which may be inspected at the office of the Chief Planning Officer, Penns Place, Durford Road, Petersfield.

TOWN AND COUNTRY AMENITIES ACT, 1974

*Illston-on-the-Hill and Kimcote
Conservation Areas*

Notice is hereby given that the Harborough District Council in pursuance of its powers under section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, have designated parts of the village of Kimcote and the village of Illston-on-the-Hill described in the Schedule below as Conservation Areas under the provisions of section 277(1) of the Act, 1971.

Plans showing the Conservation Areas may be inspected during office hours from Monday to Friday inclusive at the Council Offices, Northampton Road, Market Harborough, and the Department of Planning and Design, 42 High Street, Market Harborough.

The effect of the designation, since the introduction of the Town and Country Amenities Act, 1974, is summarised as follows:

Anyone wishing to demolish a building within a Conservation Area must first apply for listed building consent to the local planning authority (certain buildings are excluded).

Anyone wishing to cut down, lop, top, uproot or damage any tree in a Conservation Area must give the District Council 6 weeks notice of his intention.

Anyone failing to maintain in a proper state of repair any unoccupied listed building, or in certain circumstances, an unoccupied unlisted building, is liable for any costs incurred by the local planning authority in carrying out urgent repairs under the terms of section 101 of the 1971 Act.

SCHEDULE

Illston-on-the-Hill Conservation Area

All the village of Illston-on-the-Hill including properties and garden land fronting Main Street and those parts of Ashlands Road (from its junction with Main Street to its junction with Illston Lane); Gaulby Road (from its junction with Main Street to the western boundary of the Recreation Ground); and Illston Lane (from its junction with Ashlands Road to its junction with Main Street).

Kimcote Conservation Area

That part of the village of Kimcote including all properties and garden land fronting Main Street and Poultney Lane.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971—SECTION 210

*Harborough District Council, W.71 Ullesthorpe (Part) Public
Path Diversion Order 1977*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 1st July 1977 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Harborough District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that part of footpath W.71 which commences at a point approximately 189 metres north-east of its junction with Mill Road and runs in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 168 metres; then turns in a north-north-easterly direction along the western boundary of the disused railway line for a distance of approximately 457 metres to a point on the southern boundary of Field No. O.S. 1261 (May, 1962, Revised Edition) to a line commencing at a point approximately 189 metres north-east of its junction with Mill Road; turning in an easterly direction along the southern boundary of the Golf Course for a distance of approximately 82 metres; then turning north-east along the route of the disused railway line for a distance of approximately 561 metres; and finally turning in a north-north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 40 metres where it re-joins the present footpath at a point on the southern boundary of Field No. O.S. 1261 (May, 1962, Revised Edition).

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Northampton Road, Market Harborough, Leics., between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. and 4.45 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the District Secretary, Harborough District Council, Council Offices, Northampton Road, Market Harborough, Leics., not later than 5th August, 1977 and should state the grounds upon which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Harborough District Council, may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of
