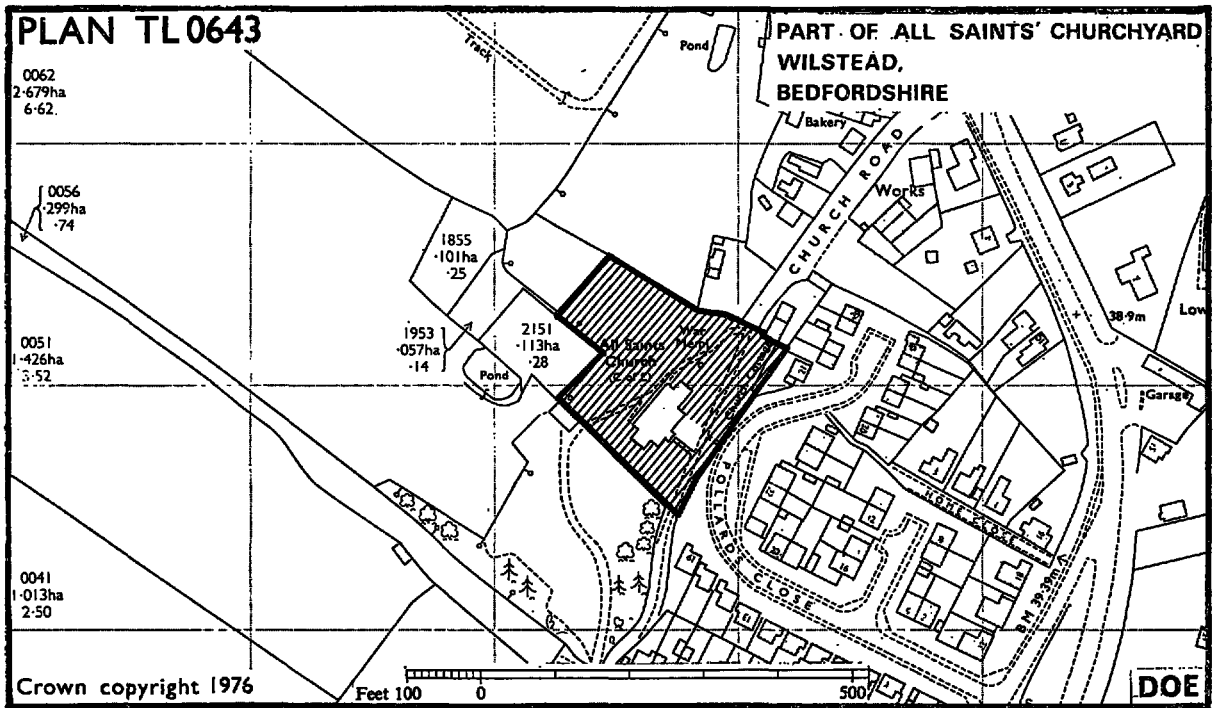


(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said part of the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the

body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.
 2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (All Saints' Churchyard, Wilstead, Bedfordshire) Order 1977.

ROYAL WARRANT OF PRECEDENCE

Queen Anne's Gate, London S.W.1.

The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that The Honourable Desmond Clive Chichester, M.C., Major (retired) Coldstream Guards, shall henceforth have, hold and enjoy the same title, rank, place, pre-eminence and precedence as the son of a Marquess which would have been due to him had his father Arthur Claud Spencer, Baron Templemore, K.C.V.O., D.S.O., O.B.E., who died on the second day of October 1953 survived his kinsman Edward Arthur Donald St. George Hamilton, Marquess of Donegall, and thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Marquess of Donegall.

And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Accountant's Office (Bank Buildings) at the Bank of England on Friday, the 15th July 1977 at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877, and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £300,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 18th July 1977 to Friday the 22nd July 1977 inclusive and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one new half-penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
