Notice is hereby given that Her Majesty was pleased on the 29th July 1977 by Orders in Council to confirm the following Schemes made by the Church Commissioners for

1. (1) Dissolving the benefice of Colebrooke and Down Saint Mary with Clannaborough; (2) creating a new benefice of Colebrooke and a new benefice of Down Saint Mary with Clannaborough, and (3) authorising the holding in plurality of the new benefice of Colebrooke and the benefice of Bow (or Nymet Tracy) with Broad Nymet in the diocese of Exeter.

2. Providing for the parish church of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, Upper Teddington, in the diocese of London, to be declared redundant and demolished following the provision of a new place of worship within the parish.

(1) Uniting the benefices of Sandhutton with Gate and Upper Helmsley; and Bossall with Buttercrambe; (2) altering the areas of the parishes of Scrayingham with Leppington and Howsham; and Bossall with Buttercrambe; and (3) altering the names of the benefice and parish of Scrayingham with Leppington and Howsham, the parish of Bossall with Buttercrambe, and the parish of Sandhutton, in the diocese of York.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971—SECTION 211

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 211 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 to authorise the stopping up of lengths and parts of (a) James Street, (b) Clarence Street and (c) Bathurst Street (between Clarence Terrace and Oystermouth Road) to facilitate the movement of traffic on Stage 1 of the West Perimeter Road which is a highway to be constructed in accordance with planning permission granted under Part III of that Act.
