HIGHWAYS ACT 1959—SECTION 111

Hambleton District Council (Springfield to Cleveland Avenue, Stokesley) Public Path Diversion Order No. 1, 1977.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 27th April 1977, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Hambleton District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the public right of way running from a point approximately 10 metres south-south-east of junction A.172 Springfield/Eastfields, shown on Ordnance Survey Sheet No. N.Z.5208 (Edition 1965), travelling along the old Auction Mart access road (now "Farmway Limited") in a north-east to east-north-east direction, adjoining "Mill Riggs" for a distance of approximately 250 metres, to a line running approximately 18 metres south-south-east of junction A.172 Springfield/Eastfields, shown on the map referred to above to a point in O.S. Field 7271 some 35 metres in a north-easterly direction. Turning south-east for a distance of approximately 8 metres, thence in an east-north-easterly direction in close proximity to the boundary of O.S. Field 9376 for a distance of approximately 58 metres to a point at the "Old Mill". Passing into O.S. Field 9376, the path travels parallel to the northern boundary in a north-easterly direction for a distance of some 12 metres whereupon cutting into O.S. Field 9790, extends a further 134 metres parallel to the southern boundary in a north-easterly direction terminating at a point shown on the map referred to above.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Stokesley, and at the Council Offices, The Old Vicarage, Northallerton, during normal office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to The Secretary, Hambleton District Council, Council Offices, The Old Vicarage, Northallerton, before 15th September 1977, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Hambleton District Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

PART I

Description of Site of Existing Way

That part of Bridleway No. 21 which commences at the junction with Footpath No. 22 and runs in a westerly direction for 34 metres (37 yards) then in a north-north-westerly direction for 464 metres (508 yards).

PART II

Description of Site of Alternative Highway

A 2½ metre wide grass bridleway which commences at the junction with Footpath No. 22 and runs in a northerly direction along the west side of a drive for 369 metres (407 yards) then in a north-westerly direction along a 2½ metre wide earth, woodland path for 204 metres (223 yards) to rejoin the existing bridleway at the northern end of the way described in Part I of this Schedule; a total distance of 573 metres (627 yards).
