

HIGHWAYS ACTS 1959 TO 1971

The London—Great Yarmouth Trunk Road (London Road North, Lowestoft Detrunking) Order 1977

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 7 of the Highways Act 1959, the effect of which is to provide that the length of the London—Great Yarmouth Trunk Road, which extends from its junction with Waveney Road northwards to a point 100 metres north of the junction with Milton Road, a distance of approximately 680 metres (744 yards) shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date on which the Order comes into operation.

Copies of the Order and of the relevant plan have been deposited at the Departments of the Environment and Transport, 2 Marsham Street, London S.W.1, and at the offices of the Regional Controller (Roads and Transportation), Eastern, 49-51 Goldington Road, Bedford; Suffolk County Council, County Hall, Ipswich; Waveney District Council, Town Hall, Lowestoft, where they are open to inspection free of charge at all reasonable hours.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959 or the Highways Act 1971 or on the ground that any requirement of either of those Acts, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks from the 26th August 1977, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

The Bath—Lincoln Trunk Road (Bidford Diversion Side Roads and Variation) Order 1977

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes, in relation to the above mentioned trunk road at Bidford in the County of Warwickshire to make under sections 9 and 286 of the Highways Act 1959, and sections 3 and 62 of the Highways Act 1971 an Order which will authorise him—

- (a) to vary the Bath—Lincoln Trunk Road (Bidford Diversion Side Roads) Order 1974;
- (b) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways;
- (c) to stop up highways;
- (d) to stop up private means of access to premises; and
- (e) to provide new means of access to premises, all at Bidford aforesaid.

The Manchester-Burnley Trunk Road (A56 Diversion Haslingden By Pass Side Roads) (No. 2) Order 1977

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that, in relation to the proposed Haslingden By Pass in the County of Lancashire, he has made under section 9 of the Highways Act 1959 an Order, the effect of which is:

- (a) to authorise him to stop up a length of Footpath No. 182 (Haslingden near Plantation Mill, Flip Road, and to construct a new replacement footpath, and
- (b) to provide for the transfer of the said new footpath to the County Council of Lancashire as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new footpath has been completed.
