ANCIENT MONUMENTS CONSOLIDATION AND AMENDMENT ACT 1913

The Trunk Road (Various Roads, Llanidloes) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales proposes to make an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974. The effect of the Order is:

1. to revoke the Trunk Road (Various Roads, Llanidloes) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1970;
2. to prohibit the waiting of any vehicle at any time on the sides of road specified in Schedules 1 and 2 to this notice;
3. to prohibit the waiting of any vehicle between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday on the side of road specified in Schedule 3 to this notice; and
4. to prohibit the waiting of any vehicle between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday for a longer period than 45 minutes in any 75 minutes on the sides of road specified in Schedule 4 to this notice.

Exceptions are provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait on any of the sides of road specified in Schedules 2, 3 and 4 to this notice for so long as may be necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with
