The Trunk Road (Bronllys, Powys) (One-Way Traffic) Order 197

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales proposes to make an Order under sections 1, 9 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974. The effect of the Order will be (1) to make the length of road specified in Schedule 1 to this notice one way from north to south and (2) to make the length of road specified in Schedule 2 to this notice one way from south to north.
