The QUEEN has been pleased to issue an Amending Warrant under Her Majesty's Royal Sign Manual to the following effect:

#### ELIZABETH R.

Elizabeth the Second, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of Her other realms and territories Queen, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith to all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting! Whereas We did by a Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the twenty-eighth day of October, one thousand nine hand and for for for the rest of Model doing

hundred and fifty-five, institute and create a Medal designated the Colonial Prison Service Medal and did make, ordain and establish rules and ordinances for the governance of the same, reserving to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting or dispensing with the rules and ordinances, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Sign Manual

Our Sign Manual; And whereas We deem it expedient that the said Warrant shall be amended to provide that the Medal shall be avail-able to members of all ranks of Prison staff, and that previous service in the Police Force of a given Colony or Territory may be allowed to reckon towards the required period of qualifying service for the award of the Medal: Now therefore We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors ordain and appoint that the said Warrant shall be amended as follows: The following shall be substituted for Clause Fifthly of the said Warrant:

Eligibility and Service required.-The Medal shall be awarded to staff of all ranks in the Prison Service who have completed not less than eighteen years' whole-time have completed not less than eighteen years' whole-time and continuous service in the Prison Service in any Colony or Territory under Our Protection, or an aggre-gate of eighteen years' whole-time and continuous service in the Prison Service in one or more Colonies or Terri-tories under Our Protection, as defined in the Regulations hereinafter mentioned; and at the discretion of the autho-rities concerned may also be awarded to staff in Prison Service who have completed an aggregate of eighteen years' whole-time and continuous service partly in the Police Force and party in the Prison Service of a given Colony or Territory under Our Protection.
