# The Langbaurgh (Bakehouse Square, Guisborough) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1978

This Order makes it unlawful for anyone to drive or permit to be caused to be driven a vehicle over the section of highway to the south of the old Town Hall from a point in line with the eastern end of the old Town Hall for a distance of 11 metres in a westerly direction to a point in line with the front of number 4 Bakehouse Square.

#### The Langbaurgh (Various Streets, Guisborough) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1978

This Order makes it unlawful to leave your vehicle at at any time in Bakehouse Square from its junction with Westgate for the full distance around the Square and on Westgate from the north-east corner of the Town Hall for the full distance around the area between the Town Hall and the Seven Stars Public House with the usual exemptions for loading and unloading etc.

# The Langbaurgh (Southampton Street, Redcar) (Experimental Prohibition of Driving) Order 1978

This Order makes it unlawful for anyone, for a period of six months from the date of making publication of this Notice to cause any vehicle to be driven over that part of Southampton Street, Redcar, from a point 20 metres south of its junction with Thrush Road for a distance of 2 metres in a southerly direction.

# The Langbaurgh (Cleveland Street, Redcar) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1978

This Order makes it unlawful for any person to cause any vehicle to proceed in that length of road known as Cleveland Street (West) Redcar, which extends from its junction with Station Road for a distance of 3 metres in a westerly direction.
