The Order becomes operative as from the date of publication of this notice, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or of any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the making of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within 6 weeks from the date of publication of this notice, made application for the purpose to the High Court.

The Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Historic Build-ings and Ancient Monuments Act 1953 and now vested in him, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

In this Order:

 (1) "the Act" means the Historic Buildings and Ancient Monuments Act 1953;
 (2) "the monument" means the ancient monument

shown on the plan annexed to this Order and thereon coloured pink know as Silchester Roman Town in the Parish of Silchester in the County of Hampshire; (3) "the Secretary of State" means the Secretary of

State for the Environment.

2. The monument (with respect to which an interim preservation notice served under section 10 of the Act is in force) is hereby placed under the more lasting protection of the Secretary of State.

- 3. Any question as to a person's right to compensation under section 12 (2) of the Act, or as to the amount of any such compensation which is appropriate in the circumstances, shall, [both as respects this Order and as respects the interim preservation notice superseded by this Order], in default of agreement be determined by the Lands Tribunal as may appear to the Tribunal to be just.
- 4. This Order may be cited as the Silchester Roman Town Preservation Order 1978 and shall come into 1978. operation on
