### The County of Durham (Thorpe Road, Horden) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1978

Notice is hereby given that on the 2nd February 1978 the County Council of Durham made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order which will come into operation on the 4th February 1978, will be to prohibit the driving of vehicles at any time on that length of Thorpe Road at Horden in Easington District from its junction with Sun-derland Road (Road B.1283) to a point immediately west of Conyers Crescent near No. 49 Thorpe Road. There will be exemptions in the Order in respect of buses,

access to premises, post office vehicles, picking up and setting down of passengers, building operations, demolitions, re-moval of obstructions, maintenance of the roads, statutory powers etc.

## **ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967**

The County of Durham (Various Road, Durham City) (Experimental Prohibition of Commercial Vehicles of Over 3 Tons Unladen Weight) (Extension No. 1) Order 1978.

Notice is hereby given that the Durham County Council by an Order dated 2nd February 1978 made under section 9 (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 (which said Act of 1967 as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1967") have directed that the County Council of Durham (Various Roads, Durham City) (Experimental Prohibition of Com-mercial Vehicles of Over 3 Tons Unladen Weight) Order 1977 made on the 4th August 1977 shall continue in force until the 2nd August 1978. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit heavy commercial vehicles the unladen weight of which exceeds 3 tons proceeding in any of the lengths of roads at Durham City in the City of Durham District specified in the Schedule to this notice. The extension Order will

the Schedule to this notice. The extension Order will come into operation on the 3rd February 1978 and will enable the County Council to make a better appraisal of its effect.

The Order contains exemptions in respect of conveying of persons, goods or merchandise to premises; purposes of agriculture; maintenance of roads; fire brigade, police and ambulance purposes; garaging repair or servicing of vehicles; statutory powers; circus, fairs or other events and conveyance of goods for sale etc.
