

in a northerly direction to a new line running from the point on the north side of Grains Road in a generally northerly direction for a distance of approximately 385 feet and then rejoining the existing footpath.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it have been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Borough Solicitor's Office, Oliver House, Oliver Street, Oldham, during normal office hours, Mondays to Fridays.

This Order became operative on the 27th January 1978, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may, under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within 6 weeks from the 3rd February 1978, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

#### NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

#### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971—SECTION 210

*Rotherham Borough Council (Rawmarsh Shopping Centre Complex) (No. 1) Public Paths Stopping-Up Order 1978.*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 30th January 1978 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment or to be confirmed by Rotherham Borough Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish the public rights of way described in the Schedule hereto.

A copy of the Order and of the two maps contained in the Order have been deposited at the Department of Legal and Administrative Services, Civic Building, Frederick Street, Rotherham, South Yorkshire and may be inspected free of charge at that address between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Rotherham Borough Council at the above address not later than the 6th March 1978 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Rotherham Borough Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment with the Order.

#### SCHEDULE

Description of footpaths to be stopped-up:

(a) on the ground floor level of the Complex, shown on map reference No. 9236/49/1, the footpath running from a point A on the said map, which point is located in the north-eastern corner of the development for a distance of 32.5 metres in a southerly direction to a point B and from point B in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 6 metres to a point C. The width of this footpath is 1.5 metres.

(b) on the first floor level of the Complex, shown on map reference No. 9236/50/1, the following footpaths:

(i) the footpath, passing through the Arcade which runs from a point A on the said map, which point is situated at the back of the High Street footpath, for a distance of 35.8 metres in an easterly direction to point B on the said map. The width of this footpath is 8.3 metres.

(ii) the footpath which runs from a point C on the said map, which point is situated in the south-western corner of the central core of the Complex, in a northerly direction for a distance of 46.4 metres to a point D on the said map. The width of this footpath is 4 metres.

(iii) the footpath which runs from the said point D on the said map, which point is situated in the north-

western corner of the central core of the Complex, in an easterly direction for a distance of 22.4 metres to a point E on the said map. The width of this footpath is 4 metres.

(iv) the footpath, linking the former footpath (D to E) described in (iii) above with the central spiral footpath, extending from the point F on the said map, which point is situated on the southern edge of the footpath running from D to E, for a distance of 3.2 metres in a southerly direction to the point G on the said map on the spiral footpath. The width of this footpath is 2.7 metres.

(v) the footpath, which runs from point K on the said map, which point is situated on the eastern edge of the footpath running from point C to point D on the said map at a distance of 18 metres from point C, in an easterly direction for 13.5 metres to a point L on the said map. The width of this footpath is 4 metres.

(vi) the footpath which runs from the said point L on the said map in a southerly direction to a point M on the said map, which point is situated at the southern end of the central core of the Complex, for a distance of 11 metres in a southerly direction. The width of this footpath is 4 metres.

(vii) the footpath which runs from point N on the said map, which point N is situated on the eastern side of the footpath running from points L to M on the said map at a distance of 7.4 metres from point L in an easterly direction for a distance of 9 metres to the point P situated in the south-western corner of the Complex. The width of this footpath is 3.5 metres.

(c) on the second floor level of the Complex, also shown on map reference No. 9236/50/1, the footpath which links the spiral footpath with the multi-storey car park to the east, extending from a point J on the said map for a distance of 7.7 metres to a point H on the said map. The width of this footpath is 2.5 metres.

(d) the footpath also shown on map reference No. 9236/50/1, which rises as a spiral in an anti-clockwise direction from a point R on the said map which point R is on the ground level, for a distance of 122.8 metres to the point S on the said map. The width of the footpath is 2.4 metres.

*The St. Edmundsbury Borough Council (Footpath No. 2 Rougham) Public Path Diversion Order, 1978*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on the 25th January 1978, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed by the St. Edmundsbury Borough Council as an unopposed Order.
