The Cumbria County Council (Footpath No. 84020, Guards, Gretna) Public Path Extinguishment Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that on 7th November 1977, the Cumbria County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to extinguish the length of public right of way running from Guards, Gretna north-eastwards for a distance of approximately 85 yards, thence south-eastwards for approximately 135 yards and east-north-eastwards for approximately 510 yards to the railway.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at The Post Office, Gretna between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday in each week and between 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturday in each week.

The Order becomes operative as from 3rd February 1978, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 of the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 3rd February 1978, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to extinguish the public right of way running from a point approximately 50 yards south-south-east of the north-west corner of O.S. Field No. 0006 for a distance of approximately 330 yards south-south-eastwards to Guards, Gretna.

Cumbria County Council (Footpath No. 80003, Cumrenton Irthington) Public Path Diversion Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that on 7th November 1977 the Cumbria County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way running from a point on the private

road to Cumrenton Farm, Irthington, west-north-westwards for approximately 30 yards, then westwards for approximately 105 yards to a point approximately 45 yards east of the point on the path on the boundary between O.S. Field Nos. 0132 and 8635 to a line running from the said point on the private road to Cumrenton Farm north-westwards for approximately 35 yards, then westwards for approximately 80 yards, and west-south-westwards for approximately 35 yards to a new stile on the boundary between O.S. Field Nos. 1146 and 0132 to join the existing path at the aforementioned point.

HIGHWAYS ACT 1959, SECTION 111

The Derbyshire County Council (Public Footpath No. 1 Chellaston) Public Path Diversion Order 1978

Notice is hereby given that the above-mentioned Order made on 2nd February 1978, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the Derbyshire County Council.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that part of public footpath No. 1 at Chellaston running generally south-westerly from a point approximately 93 yards from its junction with the A.514 to a point at grid reference 37482955 (near the sewerage works) a distance of 637 yards or thereabouts; to a new line, from and to the above-mentioned points but generally to the south and west of the existing line, a distance of 677 yards or thereabouts.

Copies of the Order and the map contained in it have been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the County Offices, Matlock (Room 108) between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays, and at the office of the City Secretary, Derby City Council, Council House, Derby during normal office hours.

Any representations or objections with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Clerk of the County Council, County Offices, Matlock not later than Friday, 3rd March 1978, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Derbyshire County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
