The County of Cornwall (Cadgwith) (Seasonal Restrictions on Waiting) Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that on the 31st January 1978 the Cornwall County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 the effect of which is to prohibit (subject to the normal exceptions operating in Cornwall) the waiting of vehicles between 9 a.m.-6 p.m. daily from 1st May-30th September (both dates inclusive) in each year in either of the lengths of road at Cadgwith specified in the Schedule hereto.

DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Devon (Generals Lane and Church Street, Starcross) (Prohibition and Limitation of Waiting) Order 1978.

Notice is hereby given that the Devon County Council propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended.

When the proposed Order comes into effect, you will not be allowed:

- to leave your vehicle at any time in the following lengths of road:

Generals Lane, both sides, between the top of the slipway and the western boundary of the hospital annex, a distance of 52 metres (57 yards) measured along the centre line.

- to leave your vehicle between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. daily in the following lengths of road:

Church Street:

north side, from its junction with the A.379 for a distance of 146.5 metres (160 yards) in a westerly direction;

south side, from its junction with the A.379 for a distance of 73 metres (80 yards) in a westerly direction.

Exemptions in the Order permit waiting for the purpose of boarding and alighting, loading or unloading, Post Office services, maintenance of the road, supply of gas, water and electricity, pursuance of statutory powers or duties, taking in petrol, oil or air from a garage. The statutory exemptions for disabled persons' vehicles are included.

Full details of the proposals are contained in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the affected lengths of road and a statement of the County Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be inspected during usual office hours, Monday to Friday, at the offices of Teignbridge District Council, Kingsteignton Road, Newton Abbot, or at the address shown below.

If you wish to object to the proposed Order, you must send the grounds for your objection in writing to the undersigned by 10th March 1978.

DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Devon (Barton Hill and Fay Road, Dawlish) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1978

Notice is hereby given that the Devon County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended, extending existing restrictions in Dawlish.

When the proposed Order comes into effect, you will not be allowed to leave your vehicle at any time in the following lengths of road.

Barton Hill, east side, from its junction with Coryton Close northwards for a distance of 6.5 metres (7 yards).
Fay Road, both sides, whole length.

There will be certain other minor variations to existing restrictions affecting Barton Hill arising from the consolidation and metrication of the existing restrictions.
