If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, any representations and objections which have been made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1968

The County of Wiltshire (Footpaths Nos. 4 and 15, Wroughton) Public Path Diversion Order, 1977

Notice is hereby given that on the 8th February 1978 the Wiltshire County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed without modification, is:

- (i) A length of Footpath 4 which runs from the unclassified road 3060 at a point to the north of Elcombe Hall Farm through O.S. Parcel numbers 1252, 2457 and 3672 (O.S. edition of 1970) would be diverted along a route which would run from the unclassified road 3060 at a point near Westnead Farm across O.S. 3672 (O.S. edition of 1970) in a north-easterly direction to rejoin the original route of Footpath 4, near the easternmost point of O.S. 3672, where Footpath 4 meets Footpath 8, Wroughton.
- (ii) A length of Footpath 15 which runs from the unclassified road 3060 at a point to the south of Elcombe Hall Farm through O.S. Parcel number 2600 (O.S. edition of 1970) in a westerly direction, and then in a southerly direction through O.S. 0005 (O.S. edition of 1970) would be diverted along a route which would run from the unclassified road 3060 at a point just to the west of Elcombe Hall in a south-westerly direction to rejoin the original route of Footpath 15 at a point just north of where the footpath intersects Bridleway 16, Wroughton.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the map contained in it has been deposited at the County Solicitor and Clerk's Office (Environment Division), County Hall, Trowbridge, and may be inspected during normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative when the said County Council have certified that the alternative footpath has been provided, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959 as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 9th February 1978, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
