to become operative on the 19th February 1978, the effect of which will be:

- 1. to revoke The City Council of Liverpool (Walton Hall Avenue, etc.) (No Waiting) Order 1968, insofar as it relates to the restriction of waiting between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays in Walton Hall Avenue, Walton Village and Walton Lane;
- 2. to revoke The City Council of Liverpool Parking Places (Liverpool) Order 1973, insofar as it relates to the Lane at its junction with Tetlow Street and Bodmin

3. to prohibit any vehicle to proceed from:

- (a) the eastern to the western carriageway; or (b) the western to the eastern carriageway, of Walton Lane at its junction with Tetlow Street and Bodmin Road:

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as subsequently amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from the 27th January 1978, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
