NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971—SECTION 210

The Metropolitan Borough of Barnsley (Undefined Footpath at Kexborough) Public Path Diversion Order, 1978

Notice is hereby given that the above-mentioned Order made on the 12th January 1978 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way from a line commencing at a point in Priestley Avenue on the eastern side of 31 Priestley Avenue and running in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 41 yards into the Kexborough Recreation Ground to a new line commencing at the same point in Priestley Avenue and running firstly in an easterly direction along Priestley Avenue for a distance of 27 yards and then in a northerly direction inside the said Recreation Ground for a distance of 27 yards to meet the existing footpath.

Copies of the Order and map contained in it have been deposited at the Department of Administration and Law, Town Hall, Barnsley and at the Area Office, Council Office, Darton and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the undersigned (quoting reference SRM/LR/Hwys.4/1-47) not later than the 13th March 1978, and should state the grounds on which they are made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

The Metropolitan Borough of Barnsley (Footpath No. 17, Darfield) Public Path Diversion Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that on the 3rd February 1978 the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council confirmed the above-mentioned Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way running from the north-western corner of the curtilage of 23 Alba Close, Darfield firstly in a southerly direction along the western boundaries of 13-23 Alba Close, then in a north-easterly direction between 11 and 13 Alba Close to its junction with Alba Close, then in a south-easterly direction to a point in Lombard Crescent, then in a south-westerly direction between 71 and 73 Lombard Crescent and finally in a south-easterly direction along the southern boundaries of 27-71 Lombard Crescent to a line commencing at the rear of 27 Lombard Crescent and running firstly in a north-westerly direction parallel with the existing footpath and then in a northerly direction

between 27 and 29 Lombard Crescent into Lombard Crescent.

The Order becomes operative as from the 10th February 1978 but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he may under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act, as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
