The Derbyshire County Council (Public Footpath Nos. 80 and 82—Heanor) Public Path Stopping-Up Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 1st December 1977, was confirmed by the Derbyshire County Council as an unopposed Order, on 2nd February 1978.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed without modification, is to stop-up Public Footpath Nos. 80 and 82 Heanor (as more particularly described below) to allow coal extraction and subsequent reclamation works to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted:

Public Footpath No. 80—from its junction with Station Road in a generally south-westerly direction to its junction with Lacey Fields Road, a distance of 850 yards or thereabouts.

Public Footpath No. 82—from its junction with Aldreds Lane in a generally easterly direction to its junction with Lime Avenue, a distance of 580 yards or thereabouts.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the County Offices, Matlock (Room 108), between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.

This Order becomes operative from 3rd February 1978 but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may, under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within 6 weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
