PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 1978

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on the 27th January 1978 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the West Devon District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the Public Right of Way running from Lane End Hill to Eastlands Farm in the Parish of Mary Tavy commencing at a point lying some 25 yards to the west of the County road, running beside St. Mary's Church on the boundary of O.S. Plot Nos. 8673 and 8182 (SX Sheet 5078—Revised May 1952) and proceeding firstly in a westerly direction along the said boundary in O.S. Plot No. 8182 for some 10 yards secondly in a north-westerly direction for approximately 30 yards across O.S. Plot No. 8371 until it crosses the Cholwell Brook and thirdly in an irregular north-westerly direction across O.S. Plot Nos. 7979 and 7385 for a distance of some 150 yards until it reaches a point about 40 yards from the junction of the Mary Tavy to Horndon road with the aforementioned County Road running past St. Mary's Church in the Parish of Mary Tavy, to a line commencing some 25 yards to the west of the County Road beside St. Mary's Church and proceeding firstly in an irregular westerly and north-westerly direction across O.S. Plot No. 8182 at times alongside the aforementioned Cholwell Brook for a distance of some 110 yards and then in a mainly north-north-westerly direction for a distance of about 50 yards across O.S. Plot Nos. 8182 and 7587 until it reaches a point which said point lies at the immediate junction of the aforementioned two County roads in the Parish of Mary Tavy.

PUBLIC PATH (PART) DIVERSION ORDER 1978

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on the 27th January 1978 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the West Devon District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert part of the Public Right of Way running in the vicinity of the North Hooe Mine on the banks of the River Tamar in the Parish of Bere Ferrers, being that part commencing at a point lying some 80 yards to the north of the south-west corner of O.S. Plot No. 6706 and proceeding in a mainly north-westerly direction across O.S. Plot No. 6706 and proceeding in a mainly north-westerly direction across O.S. Plot Nos. 6706 and 7515 (SX Sheet 4266—Revised May 1952) for a distance of some 60 yards to a point which lies approximately 20 yards from the north-western corner of O.S. The Essex County Council Footpath 19 Thorpe-le-Soken Public Path Extinguishment Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that on 30th January 1978 the Essex County Council confirmed the above-named Orders.

The effect of the Order relating to Footpath 17 Thorpe-le-Soken will be to extinguish the public right of way commencing at a point A on the map contained in the Order, about 1,900 feet south-east of Landermere Hall, and running in a north-easterly direction for about 820 feet and thence in a north-westerly direction for about 900 feet to a point B. The effect of the Order relating to Footpath 19 Thorpe-le-Soken will be to extinguish the public right of way commencing at a point D on the map contained in the Order, about 2,500 feet north-west of Landermere Hall and running in a north-easterly and a generally northerly direction for about 1,500 feet to point E.

The Essex County Council have entered into a footpath creation agreement with the owners of the land which will create two public footpaths as replacements for the paths which will be extinguished under these Orders.
