ROYAL BOROUGH OF KENSINGTON AND CHELSEA
Revocation and Designation of Parking Places

Notice is hereby given that, on the application of the Council of the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea, the Greater London Council on 1st February 1978, made the Kensington and Chelsea (Parking Places) (No. 2) Order 1978, under sections 35, 36, 37, 40 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968.

2. The general effect of the Order will be to—

- (a) revoke the designation by the Order listed in column 1 of the Schedule to this notice, of the parking place allocated the number specified in column 2 of that Schedule and which is situated in the highway specified in column 3 of that Schedule;
- (b) (i) designate residents' parking places in Chesham Place and Chesham Street, Elvaston Place, Nevern Road, Nevern Square, Queen's Gate and Templeton Place at which charges may be made by the Royal Borough Council for vehicles authorised by the Order to be left in those parking places and to provide that in respect of those parking places the charge will be at the rate of 20p a day;
N.B. If a season ticket is displayed on a vehicle left in a parking place, the daily charge is not payable. Season tickets cost £10 or £35 for tickets expiring at the end of 3 months and 12 months respectively, running from the beginning of the month in which they are issued;
- (ii) provide that the parking places will operate between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and between 8.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m. on Saturdays (Christmas Day, Good Friday and Bank Holidays excepted);
- (iii) provide that the vehicles which may be left in a parking place shall be those displaying a valid permit issued by the Royal Borough Council;
- (iv) provide that certain vehicles may wait free of charge in certain circumstances, e.g., to allow persons to board or alight (maximum 2 minutes) to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes) and vehicles left by specified disabled persons (no time limit).

3. The restrictions imposed by the Kensington and Chelsea (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 will apply to any areas previously designated as parking places and not re-designated as such as they apply in the immediate vicinity.

4. A copy of the Order, which will come into operation for the purposes of the installation of ticket parking meters, placing of traffic signs, etc., on 13th February 1978, and for all other purposes on 20th February 1978, of the Orders referred to in paragraph 2(a) above, of the Kensington and Chelsea (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 (and of the Orders which have previously amended or applied those Orders) and of the map which indicates each length of road to which the Order relates can be inspected until the end of 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, in Room B.21, The County Hall, London, SE1 7PB.

5. Copies of the Order may be purchased from the Information Centre, Greater London Council, The County Hall, London, SE1 7PB.

6. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, or on the ground that any requirement of those sections of the Act or of section 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act, or of any regulations made under the said section 84C, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

The Hackney (Prescribed Route) (No. 1) Traffic Order 1978

Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council on 3rd February 1978 made the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by the Transport Act 1976 and the Road Traffic Act 1974.

2. The effect of the Order will be to impose one-way working for vehicular traffic from south-west to north-east in Eagle Wharf Road.

3. Exemption has been provided in the Order in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform.

4. A copy of the Order, which will come into operation on 13th February 1978, and of the Hackney (Prescribed Route) (No. 1) Traffic Order 1975 (which imposed one-way working in a length of Eagle Wharf Road and which Order will be revoked) can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end

of 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made in Room B.21, The County Hall, London, SE1 7PB.
