*The Salop County Council Coalport War Memorial  
Footbridge Public Path Creation Order 1978*

Notice is hereby given that the above Order made on the 1st February 1978 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or in the absence of any objections to be confirmed by the Salop County Council as an unopposed Order.

Its effect will be to create a public footpath from the Coalport to Ironbridge Road at the western end of the road bridge over the old canal incline for a distance of approximately 90 feet to the Coalport Memorial Footbridge, this section being 5 feet wide and running down a stepped slope to the canal bank which is then followed to the footbridge. The footpath then crosses the Coalport War Memorial Footbridge and drops down to the highway opposite the Boat Inn by a flight of wooden steps which forms part of the bridge structure.
