SCHEDULES

Schedule 1-Footpath Diversions

Existing Route

That part of F.P. No. 50 which runs from a point approximately 40 metres south of its junction with F.P. No. 49 in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 200

Proposed New Route

The F.P. will run from the same point approximately 40 metres south of its junction with F.P. No. 49 in a generally southerly direction for a distance of approximately 210 metres following the field boundary to the east of Sutton Shaw to meet to the existing line of F.P. No. 50.

Existing Route

That part of F.P. No. 50 which runs from a point at the south-western corner of the woodland known as Sutton Shaw in a south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 290 metres to its junction with F.P. No. 51.

Proposed New Route

The F.P. will run from the same point at the south-western corner of Sutton Shaw in a generally southerly direction for a distance of approximately 120 metres westerly for a distance of approximately 15 metres and then along the western boundary of Highfield Wood for a further 90 metres where it will run in a westerly direction along the northern boundary of Highfield Wood for a distance of approximately 180 metres to meet the existing line of F.P. No. 51. F.P. No. 51.

Existing Route

That part of F.P. No. 50 from a point at its junction with F.P. No. 51 in a generally southerly direction for approximately 190 metres westerly for approximately 210 metres and then south-westerly for a further distance of approximately 200 metres to a point on F.P. No. 50 approximately 120 metres due east of Grange Close.

Proposed New Route

The F.P. wil run from the same point at the junction of F.P. No. 51 and the existing route of F.P. No. 50 in a generally easterly direction along the northern boundary of Highfield Wood for a distance of approximately 180 metres in a generally south south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 30 metres and then following the southern boundary of Highfield Wood in a generally easterly direction for a further 105 metres approximately from where the F.P. continues in a south-westerly direction in a straight line for a distance of approximately 290 metres passing the north-western extremity of the area of woodland and then continuing in a straight line in the same direction for a further 210 metres approximately from where the path continues to follow the field boundary in a west south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 350 metres north-westerly for approximately 65 metres north-easterly for approximately 80 metres and then north-westerly for a further 220 metres to rejoin the existing route of F.P.
