NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

Taunton Deane Borough (Footpath No. T.18/4 Norton Fitzwarren) Public Path Division Order 1978

Notice is hereby given that on 22nd February 1978 the Taunton Deane Borough Council confirmed the above named Order.

The effect of the confirmed Order will to divert part of public right of way T.18/4 running across land to the north of the easternmost footbridge over the railway at Norton Fitzwilliam onto a new line running in a north and then easterly direction to the southern end of the footbridge over Norton Brook.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it may be inspected free of charge at the Municipal Buildings, Taunton, between 8.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m., Mondays to Fridays.

This Order becomes operative as from the date on which it is certified by the Council that the provisions of Article 2 of the Order have been completed but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order he may under Schedule 6, paragraph 3 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within 6 weeks from 24th February 1978, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

WAVENEY DISTRICT COUNCIL

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971, SECTION 210

The Waveney District Council Waveney (Sands Lane, Lowestoft) Public Path No. 7 Diversion (No. 2) Order 1978.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to "the Order") made on the 23rd February 1978 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Waveney District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that part of Footpath No. 7 running from the junction of Sands Lane and Church Lane, Lowestoft in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 326

metres to the line of a new paved path between the two points.

The purpose of the Order is to enable housing development to take place which has been given planning permission under Part III, Town and Country Planning Act, 1971.

The Order supersedes the Waveney (Sands Lane, Lowestoft) Public Path No. 7 Diversion Order 1975 which did not take effect because the proposed development giving rise to it was not implemented.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge, at the District Secretary's Office, Town Hall, Lowestoft, at all reasonable hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the District Secretary at the Town Hall, Lowestoft, by no later than 24th March 1978 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any be made are withdrawn, the Waveney District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, then confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

SOUTH YORKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971, SECTION 210

The South Yorkshire County Council (Footpath No. 13, Thurnscoe) Public Path Diversion Order 1978

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the South Yorkshire Council.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to divert:

- (a) Part of footpath 13 in the former Urban District of Dearn commencing approximately 150 yards east north east of the Church of the Sacred Heart at Goldthorpe and continuing thence in a generally northerly direction for 310 yards or thereabouts and thereafter for a further 290 yards or thereabouts in a generally north-westerly direction to the junction of footpath 10 with footpath 13.

To a line:

- (b) Commencing at approximately 150 yards east north-east of the Church of the Sacred Heart at Goldthorpe in the former Urban District of Dearn and running for 200 yards or thereabouts in a generally north-westerly direction and thereafter in a northerly direction for a further 420 yards or thereabouts to its junction with footpath 10.

Width of existing and alternative ways—6 feet.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it may be inspected free of charge at the offices of (i) Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council, Town Hall, Barnsley; and (ii) The County Council, County Hall, Barnsley; and (iii) Branch Library, Shepherd Lane, Thurnscoe, Rotherham, S63 0JS.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Chief Executive, County Hall, Barnsley, no later than the 31st March 1978, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the South Yorkshire County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
