###### *The Barnet (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 73) Order 1978*

Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council on 17th February 1978 made the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968 and the Road Traffic Act 1974.

2. The general effect of the Order will be further to amend the Barnet (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1971, so that in Highfield Avenue, between the south-western kerb-line of Golders Green Road and a point 60 feet south-west of that kerb-line—

(a) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) will be prohibited between 8 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and between 5.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive;

(b) waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle for

a period of more than 20 minutes in the same place will be prohibited between 5.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive;

(c) the sale or offer for sale of goods from a vehicle will be prohibited, except on a Sunday, unless there is in force a valid licence issued by the Barnet Borough Council or the goods are immediately taken into or delivered at premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected;

(d) the use of any vehicle or of any animal or the wearing of fancy dress or other costume, wholly or mainly for the purpose of advertising, will be prohibited.

3. The prohibitions referred to in paragraph 2(a) and (b) above will not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or in certain circumstances, e.g., the picking up or setting down of passengers; the carrying out of statutory powers or duties; the taking in of petrol, etc., from roadside petrol stations; to licensed street traders, etc. The usual exemption relating to vehicles displaying a disabled person's "Orange Badge" will apply.

4.
