

SOUTH TYNESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of South Tyneside (Foreshore Parking Places) Order 1978

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of South Tyneside (pursuant to arrangements made under Section 101 of the Local Government Act, 1972, with the Tyne and Wear County Council) propose to make an Order under Sections 28, 31 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act, 1972, to control the use of the parking places named in Schedule 1 to this Notice which shows the class of vehicles and the scale of charges for each parking place. The proposed Order will also revoke the provisions of the South Shields (Off-Street Parking Places) Order, 1968, in so far as they relate to the parking places specified in Schedule 2 to this Notice.

Exceptions are contained in the Order to provide that the following vehicles may be left in a parking place and shall be exempt from the payment of a charge:

- (a) an invalid carriage or other disabled person's vehicle, and
(b) a solo motor cycle, when parked in a space which is reserved for motor cycles and signed accordingly.

Full details are contained in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the location of the parking places, may be examined at the Solicitor's Department, Town Hall, South Shields during normal office hours.

Any person wishing to object to the proposed Order should send the grounds for objection in writing to the undersigned not later than 22nd March 1978.

The Borough of South Tyneside (Arnold Street and Charles Street, Bolden Colliery) (Experimental One Way Traffic) Order 1978.

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of South Tyneside (pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act, 1972 with the Tyne and Wear County Council) propose to make an Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the proposed Order which will operate for a period of six months is to prohibit any vehicle from proceeding in the roads specified in column 1 of the First Schedule in a direction other than that specified in Column 2 of the said Schedule;

Full details of the proposals are in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the restricted roads and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing the Order, may be examined at the Solicitor's Department, Town Hall, South Shields, during normal office hours.

If you wish to object to the proposed Order, or of any provision contained in it, you should send the grounds for your objection in writing to the undersigned not later than 22nd March 1978.
