Whereas it is expedient to provide additional benefits for those members of the Naval and Marine Reserves who are injured in the course of their duties, and for the dependants of those killed in similar circumstances:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865 (1865 c. 73) and section 1 of the Naval and Marine Reserves Pay Act 1957 (1957 c. 32) and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:
