23.—(1) The holding in plurality of the benefice of (a) Ford; and Alberbury with Cardeston (b) Minsterley; and Habberley, (c) Westbury; Yockleton; and Great Wollaston (d) Worthen; Hope with Shelve; and Middleton, and (e) Chirbury; Marton and Trelystan with Leighton; and (2) establishing a group ministry for the said benefices and the benefices of Pontesbury, first and second portions, with Cruckton; and Great Hanwood, in the diocese of Hereford.

*The London-Fishguard Trunk Road (Carmarthen Southern By-Pass) Order 1978*

*The London-Fishguard Trunk Road (Carmarthen Southern By-Pass Side Roads) Order 1978*

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that in relation to the above-mentioned Trunk Road at Carmarthen in the County of Dyfed, he has made under the Highways Act 1959:

1. an Order under section 7 which provides:

- that roads which he proposes to construct at Carmarthen in the County of Dyfed shall become trunk roads as from the date when the Order comes into operation and;
- that the length of the London-Fishguard Trunk Road to be superseded shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date on which notice is given by him to the County Council of Dyfed (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the new trunk roads are open for through traffic.

2. an Order under section 9 of the Highways Act 1959 authorising him:

- to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways;
- to stop up highways;
- to construct new highways;
- to stop up private means of access to premises;
- to provide new means of access to premises, and
- to close a highway temporarily for the purpose of enabling the new trunk roads to be constructed.

all at Carmarthen aforesaid and to provide the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Dyfed, as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highways have been completed and are open for through traffic.
