

MEDICINES ACT 1968

CERTIFICATES FOR RECLOSEABLE PHARMACEUTICAL CONTAINERS RESISTANT TO OPENING BY CHILDREN
UNDER BRITISH STANDARD 5321:1975 AS AMENDED

The Secretaries of State concerned with health in England, in Wales and in Scotland and the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, hereby give notice, in accordance with the Medicines (Child Safety) Regulations 1975, as amended by the Medicines (Child Safety) Amendment Regulations 1976, that the reclosable child-resistant containers of which particulars are given in the schedules hereto comply with British Standard 5321 published on 31st October 1975 as amended by AMD 2077 published on 16th August 1976.

It is hereby certified that the S/-/1, Supervisory Committee (Child Resistant Containers), established by the British Standards Institution, has approved the containers described below submitted for evaluation under Application No. 1005 as complying with B.S. 5321:1975 (as amended). This certificate relates to complete containers consisting of a container body and a closure taken together. It does not relate to a closure alone. *It relates only to the drawings identified by an Issue number or otherwise uniquely defined.*

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 209 of the above Act entitled "The Stopping Up of Highways (County of

West Midlands) (No. 8) Order 1978" authorising the stopping up of lengths of Queen Street, Queen Street Passage and Chapel Street, Quarry Bank, Dudley and requiring the provision of a new highway.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of the 7th April 1978 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
