If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

SCHEDULE

Footpath No. 1-Existing Route

From its junction with the A66 (Darlington Road) in a north-westerly direction for approximately 220 m. to the north-east corner of field No. 4544.

From a point approximately 550 m. along the existing route in a northerly direction for approximately 260 m. to the northern boundary of field No. 1274.

Footpath No. 2—Existing Route

From a point approxi-mately 120 m. along the existing route, east of Sandy Leas Lane, in a north-easterly direction for approximately 280 m. to the northern boundary of field No. 1274, thence in a northerly direction for approximately 240 m. to the north-west corner of field No. 2100, thence in a northeasterly direction for approximately 380 m. to the north-east corner of field No. 1530.

Proposed Route

From a point approximately 60 m. east of the existing junction with the A66 in the south-west corner of field No. 3800 in a northerly direction for approximately 150 m., thence westerly for approxi-mately 90 m., thence in a north-westerly direction for approximately 90 m. to rejoin the existing footpath.

From a point approximately 550 m along the existing route in an easterly direction for approximately 70 m., thence in a northerly direction for approximately 250 m. to the north-west corner of field No. 3800.

Proposed Route

From a point approxi-mately 120 m. along the existing route, east of Sandy Leas Lane, in a northerly direction for approximately 130 m. to the north-west corner of field No. 1274, thence in an easterly direction for approximately 310 m. to the north-east corner of field No. 1274, thence for approximately 120 m. to the south-east corner of field No. 2100, thence in a nor-therly direction for approxi-mately 120 m., thence in a north-easterly direction for approximately 130 m. to the north-east corner of field No. 2100, thence in a northdirection for approximately 90 m., thence in a north-westerly direction for approximately 140 m. to rejoin the existing footpath in the north-east corner of field No. 1530.

Footpath No. 4—Existing Route

From its junction with the A66 in a north-westerly direction for approximately 170 metres thence in a northeasterly direction approximately 60 metres to the eastern boundary of field No. 3800.

From a point on the existing route, at the south boundary of field No. 5645 in a northerly direction for approximately 640 metres to its junction with footpath No. 3.

Proposed Route

From its junction with the A66, in an easterly direction for approximately 70 metres to the south-east corner of field No. 3800, thence in a northerly direction along the east boundary of field No. 3800 for ap-proximately 190 metres to its iunction with the existing route.

From a point on the south boundary of field No. 5645 in an easterly direction for approximately 60 metres to the south-east corner of field No. 5645, thence easterly for approximately 170 metres to the south-east corner of field No. 7643, thence in a northerly direction for approximately 400 metres to the north-east corner of field No. 6860, thence in a westerly direction for approximately 20 metres, thence in a northerly direction for approximately 350 metres to rejoin footpath 3 at the north-east corner of No. 5100.
