#### CITY OF WESTMINSTER REVOCATION AND DESIGNATION OF PARKING PLACES

Notice is hereby given that, on the application of the Council of the City of Westminster, the Greater London Council on 29th March 1978 made the City of Westminster (Parking Places) (No. 2) Order 1978 under sections 35, 36, 37, 40 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968.

The general effect of the Order will be to:

- (a) revoke the designation by the Order listed in column 1 of Schedule 1 to this Notice of the parking place allocated the number specified in column 2 of that Schedule and which is situated on the highway specified in column 3 of that Schedule;
- (b) designate metered, 2-hour parking places and residents' parking places on the highways specified in Schedules 2 and 3 to this Notice respectively at which charges may be made by the City Council for vehicles authorised by the Order to be left in those parking places;
- (c) provide that the parking places will operate between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and between 8.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m. on Saturdays (Christmas Day, Good Friday and Bank Holidays excepted);
- (d) specify, in respect of the metered parking places, that passenger vehicles (12 seats or less), goods carrying vehicles, motor cycles and invalid carriages may be left therein; that the initial charge will be at the rate of 10p for 20 minutes (maximum initial period 2 hours); that the excess charge (payable to the City Council) will be £4 and the excess charge period will be 1 hour; that the unexpired time shown on the parking meter may be used free of charge and that the period during which a vehicle may not return to a parking place will be 1 hour;
- (e) specify, in respect of the residents' parking places, that vehicles displaying a valid parking card issued by the City, Council may be left therein and that the charge will be at the rate of 20p a day;

  Note. If a season ticket is displayed on a vehicle left in a residents' parking place, the daily charge is not payable. Season tickets cost £7.50 or £27 for tickets expiring at the end of three months and twelve months respectively running from the beginning of the month in which they are issued; and
- (f) provide that certain vehicles may wait free of charge in certain circumstances, e.g., to allow persons to board

or alight (maximum 2 minutes), to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes) and vehicles left by specified disabled persons (no time limit).

The restrictions imposed by, the City of Westminster (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 will apply to any areas previously designated as parking places and not re-designated as such, as they apply in the immediate vicinity.

A copy of the Order, which will come into operation for the purposes of the installation of parking meters, etc., will be so available during the aforementioned period of June 1978, of the Orders referred to in column 1 of Schedule 1 to this Notice, of the City of Westminster (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 (and of the Orders which have previously, amended or applied those Orders) and of the map which indicates each length of road to which the Order relates can be inspected until the end of six weeks from the date on which the Order was made during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in Room B.21, The County Hall, London, SE1 7PB.

Copies of the Order may be purchased from the Information Centre, Greater London Council, The County Hall, London, SE1 7PB.

Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 or on the ground that any requirement of those sections of the Act or of section 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act or of any, regulations made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
