District of Uttlesford (Footpath 3, Little Easton) Public Path Diversion Order 1978

Notice is hereby given that the above-mentioned Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 4th April 1978 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, by the District Council of Uttlesford, as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that part of Footpath 3, Little Easton which commences at a point in the south-western corner of field O.S. 1615 fronting the unclassified road and runs along the southern boundary of the field in an easterly direction for approximately 100 metres to cross the eastern field boundary at a point 10 metres north of the stream to a line commencing at the same point on the existing route in the south-western corner of field O.S. 3551 and following the western field boundary in a generally north-westerly direction for approximately 76 metres then crossing the field boundary into field O.S. 1615 and continuing in a generally north-westerly direction along the eastern field boundary for approximately 140 metres then running in a generally westerly direction along the northern field boundary for approximately 70 metres to terminate at a point fronting the unclassified road.

Abingdon Conservation Area No. 3 (Northcourt)

Notice is hereby given pursuant to section 277(7) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 as amended by section 1 of the Town and Country Amenities Act 1974 that the Vale of White Horse District Council on 27th February 1978 designated as a Conservation Area the area in Northcourt, Abingdon described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter called "the Scheduled Area"), shown edged pink on the plan which has been deposited at the offices of the Director of Planning and Development, 25 Bridge Street, Abingdon, Oxfordshire and is available for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.

The effect of the Order is that the provisions of the Town and Country Planning Acts 1971 to 1974, relating to Conservation Areas now apply to the Scheduled Area.

The appropriate consents must therefore be obtained before any person may demolish any building or structure in the Scheduled Area. Exceptions to this rule are laid down in paragraph 71 of the Department of the Environment
