(c) the sale or offer for sale of goods from a vehicle in the lengths of streets and the carriageway referred to in sub-paragraph (a) above would be prohibited, except on a Sunday, unless there is in force a valid licence issued by the Hillingdon Borough Council or the goods are immediately taken into or delivered at premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected;
