ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1967—SECTION 12 (1) The Trunk Road (Cecil Road, South Mimms) (A1) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 1978

The Trunk Road (Manchester Road, Deepcar (A.616)) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1978
