GREATER MANCHESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

Greater Manchester County Council (Barton Road and Farm Lane, Worsley) (Prohibition of Waiting) (County) Order 1976.

Notice is hereby given that on 4th April 1978 the Greater Manchester County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which is to prohibit waiting at all times on:

Barton Road (B.5211), Worsley, south-westerly side, from Farm Lane for 45 metres in a north-westerly direction.

Barton Road, Worsley, south-westerly side, from Farm Lane for 15 metres in a south-easterly direction.

Farm Lane, Worsley, both sides, from Barton Road for 52 metres in a south-westerly direction.

The Order contains exemptions to permit waiting for the purposes of boarding or alighting, unloading or loading, funerals, building operations, or work on or under the lengths of road. Disabled persons vehicles displaying a disabled persons badge, and a parking disc, will be allowed to wait for up to 2 hours, return prohibited within 1 hour.

A copy of the Order, which comes into operation on 5th May 1978, and a map showing the roads to which it relates may be inspected between 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Friday at the County Secretary's Office, County Hall, (Minshull Street Entrance), Piccadilly Gardens, Manchester or the Common Law Section, Salford City Council, Albert Mill, 214 Chorley Road, Swinton.

Any person who wishes to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it on the ground that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks from 4th April 1978, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

GREATER MANCHESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

Greater Manchester County Council (Ramsbottom Area) (Traffic Regulation) (Borough) Order 1978

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Metropolitan Borough of Bury, pursuant to arrangements made with the County Council of Greater Manchester under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 propose to make an Order under sub-sections (1), (2) and (3) of section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended, the effect of which will be:

(1) *To prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time on—*

Hope Street, Ramsbottom, south side, from the easterly kerbline of Bolton Road West for a distance of 90 metres in an easterly direction.

(2) *To prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive and between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. on Saturday on—*

Hope Street, Ramsbottom, north side, from the easterly kerbline of Bolton Road West to the westerly kerbline of Winifred Street

Winifred Street, Ramsbottom, west side, from the northerly kerbline of Hope Street to the southerly kerbline of Nuttall Lane.

(3) *To limit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive and*

between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. on Saturday to two hours in any period of three hours on—

Hope Street, Ramsbottom, north side, from the easterly kerbline of Winifred Street for a distance of 40 metres in an easterly direction.

Winifred Street, Ramsbottom, east side, from the northerly kerbline of Hope Street to the southerly kerbline of Nuttall Lane.

The proposed Order will contain exceptions to permit waiting for the purpose of boarding or alighting, loading or unloading, the removal of furniture, funerals, building operations or work on or under the lengths of road. Disabled person's vehicles displaying the relevant disabled person's badge will be allowed to wait for up to 2 hours return prohibited within 1 hour in (1) and (2) above and for an unlimited period in (3) above.

A copy of the proposed Order and a map showing the lengths of road to which it relates together with a statement of the Council's reason for proposing to make the Order, may be inspected at the office of the Director of Administration, Town Hall, Bury, during normal working hours.

Objections to the proposal, together with the grounds on which they are made must be sent in writing to the Director of Administration, Town Hall, Bury, by 5th May 1978.

NEWPORT BOROUGH COUNCIL

Newport Borough Council (Ruperra Street, East Market Street and John Street) (Prohibition of Driving and Waiting) Order 1978.

Notice is hereby given that the Newport Borough Council propose to make the above Order acting on behalf of Gwent County Council in pursuance of arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 and in exercise of Gwent County Council's powers under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effects of the Order will be as follows:

- (i) Vehicles may not proceed in part of Ruperra Street (from its junction with Lower Dock Street for a distance of 10 metres) and in East Market Street, Newport (from a point 8 metres from its junction with Ruperra Street for a distance of 2 metres in a southerly direction).
- (ii) Vehicles may not wait at any time on parts of Ruperra Street, East Market Street and John Street, Newport.
- (iii) Vehicles may not wait on part of East Market Street, Newport between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Mondays to Saturdays.

Item (i) is already in operation on an experimental basis.

This Order will make the arrangement permanent. Exceptions will be included in Order to permit waiting for the purposes of:

- (i) the picking up and setting down of passengers;
- (ii) the loading and unloading of goods;
- (iii) the delivery or collection of postal packets;
- (iv) the maintenance of the roads;
- (v) the supply of gas, water and electricity and of any telegraphic line;
- (vi) the pursuance of statutory powers or duties; and
- (vii) a funeral and disabled persons' vehicles will be allowed to wait for not more than 2 hours.

The Draft Order, maps showing the affected roads (and alternative routes) and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined at my Office between 8.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.
