Norfolk County Council (Sprowston Footpath No. 1) Public Path Extinguishment Order 1978

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 6th April 1978, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Norfolk County Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to extinguish the public right of way in the Parish of Sprowston running from Barkers Lane at a point approximately 310 metres west of Church Lane northward for approximately 212 metres and then eastwards for approximately 282 metres to Church Lane.

The Norfolk County Council is satisfied that an alternative right of way is not required.
