## NOTICE OF PUBLIC FOOTPATH ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

*(Green Lane, Darlington Road, Northallerton) Diversion Order, 1978*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on the 3rd April 1978 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Department of the Environment for confirmation as an opposed Order or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by North Yorkshire County Council.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to divert the public right of way commencing at point A on Darlington Road and running in a north-easterly direction along Green Lane to point B in O.S. Field No. 617, a distance of approximately 344 metres; the new path commencing at point C on Darlington Road and running in a generally easterly direction along the road ways of the wood nursery to point B in O.S. Field No. 617, a distance of approximately 352 metres.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it may be inspected free of charge, at County Hall, Northallerton, during normal office hours.

Any representations or objections with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the address below before 12th May 1978, and should state the grounds on which they are made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the North Yorkshire County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

## NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC FOOTPATH ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

COUNTRYSIDE ACT, 1968

*Footpath No. 31 Grassington and Footpath No. 3 Hebden Order, 1977*

Notice is hereby given that on 17th February 1978, the North Yorkshire County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way known as Footpath No. 31 Grassington and footpath No. 3 Hebden running in a north-north-easterly direction through the grounds of Grassington Hospital to a line commencing at a point 10 metres east of New Dike Laithe and running north-north-east, then east, then north along the west side of the boundary wall of the hospital grounds.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Yorkshire Dales National Park Office, Colvend, Hebden Road, Grassington, North Yorkshire and may be inspected free of charge during office hours.

Any person who wishes to claim compensation under section 113 (2) of the 1959 Act for depreciation or damage in consequence of the coming into operation of the Order must make his claim in writing addressed to the Chief Executive, County Hall, Northallerton and serve it by delivering it at, or sending it by prepaid post, to the above address by 14th October 1978.

The Order became operative as from 24th February 1978, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provisions contained therein, on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 of the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 14th April 1978, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

## EXETER CITY COUNCIL

THE CONTROL OF POLLUTION ACT, 1974

*The Exeter No. 1 Noise Abatement Order 1977*

Notice is hereby given that the Exeter City Council made the Exeter No. 1 Noise Abatement Order, 1977 on the 30th December 1977. The general effect of the Order, if confirmed by the Secretary of State, is to prohibit the noise level recorded by the Exeter City Council under the requirements of the Control of Pollution Act 1974 in respect of premises to which the order applies from being exceeded except with the consent in writing of the Council. Where any such level appears unacceptable, the Council may order its reduction where this seems attainable at reasonable cost and affords a public benefit. If as a result of construction or other works premises are to come into being which will be of a class which is subject to control, the Council may determine the level of noise which will be acceptable from those premises.

The above Order applies to the following classes of premises:

- (1) Industrial Premises;
- (2) Places of entertainment or assembly;
- (3) Transport installations;
- (4) Public utility installations;
- (5) Commercial premises (excluding shops and offices as defined in the Town and Country Planning (Use Classes) Order 1972).

If confirmed the above Order will come into operation 6 months from the date of confirmation by the Secretary of State.

The area affected by the Order is bounded by Alphington Street, Alphington Road, Marsh Barton Road, a line projected from such road in a north-easterly direction to the Paddington to Penzance Railway Line, thence along such railway line in a south-easterly direction to the north-west boundary of Water Lane Tip and along such boundary to the Exeter Canal, the Exeter Canal, and River Exe to Exe Bridge South, and a copy of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected by any person free of charge at all reasonable times during the next eight weeks at the City Environmental Health Office, Civic Centre, Exeter.

Within the period of 8 weeks from the date of this notice any persons who will be affected by the Order may by notice to the Secretary of State, at Room 489, Queen Anne Chambers, 28 Broadway, London, SW1H 9JU, object to confirmation of the Order.

5. Saxon Lane/Crouch Lane Car Park.
6. Dane Road Car Park.
7. Richmond Road Car Park.

At all the parking places contained in this Order motor cars, motor cycles and invalid carriages shall be permitted to park and in addition at Sutton Road/East Street Car
