PUBLIC PATH EXTINGUISHMENT ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT 1959

Blyth Valley Borough Council (Rothbury Avenue, Newsham Farm Estate) Public Extinguishment Order 1978

Notice is hereby given that the above-named order (hereinafter referred to as "the order") made on the 10th April 1978, is about to be submitted to the Secretary for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Blyth Valley Borough Council as an unopposed order.

The effect of the order, if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish the existing footpath approximately 25 metres of public footpath in a northerly direction between No. 25 and No. 27 Rothbury Avenue. Adequate alternative paved or made up footpaths have been provided and adopted under the development which was carried out in accordance with planning permission granted under Part III of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.

A copy of the order and a copy of the map have been deposited at the Council Offices, Seaton Delaval, Whitley Bay, Tyne and Wear, and may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Thursdays and 8.30 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Fridays.

Any representation or objection with respect to the order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Blyth Valley Borough Council, Council Offices, Seaton Delaval, Whitley Bay, Tyne and Wear, not later than the 15th May 1978, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made or if any are withdrawn, the Blyth Valley Borough Council may, instead of submitting the order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the order as an unopposed order. If the order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

County Council of Avon (Footpath No. 47 Southmead, Bristol) Public Path Diversion Order 1978

Notice is hereby given that the above-named order, made on the 11th April, 1978, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for Transport for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed order, by the County Council of Avon. The effect of the order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert that part of public footpath No. 47 at Southmead, Bristol which runs from a point approximately 230 feet from its junction with Pen Park Road first general south-westerly direction and then in a general westerly direction for a total distance of approximately 280 feet to a point approximately 510 feet along its course from Pen Park Road to a new route to run from the point approximately 230 feet from its junction with Pen Park Road in a general south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 270 feet to rejoin a line of the existing path at a point approximately 510 feet from Pen Park Road along its existing line.

A copy of the order and a plan annexed to it have been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the Director of Administration and County Solicitor (reference AWJ/PH/39/48) Avon House, The Haymarket, Bristol during normal office hours until 15th June 1978.

(Public Path Diversion) Order 1978*

Notice is hereby given that on 14th April 1978 the Nottinghamshire County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed is to divert the public right of way being Bridleway Number 12 running from a point approximately 30 yards from the junction of Shireoaks Road opposite the Bowling Green near Shireoaks Colliery in the District of Bassetlaw following a line approximately 290 yards in length to a point adjacent to the Shireoaks Colliery sidings, to a line running from the same commencement point but a more direct route to the same terminal point at Shireoaks Colliery Sidings.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the office of the Solicitor, Bassetlaw District Council, Town Hall, Worksop, Notts and also at my office at the address below between 9 am and 4.30 pm Mondays to Fridays inclusive the Order becomes operative as from 17th April 1978 but if a person aggrieved by the Order decides to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the power of the Highways Act 1959 as amended or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act as amended or on any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 17th April 1978 make an application for the purposes to the High Court.—Dated 14th April 1978.
