NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER
TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971 SECTION 210
*Rochdale Borough Council (Castleton Park) Public Paths
Diversion Order 1977*

Notice is hereby given that on 11th April 1978 the Rochdale Borough Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to:-

- (i) divert the public right of way being part of the existing footpath No. 26 running in a generally east south-easterly direction from Point A on the map annexed to the Order (the junction of the boundary fences of 29 Sherwin Way, Castleton and 82 Leander Drive, Castleton) for a distance of some 82 metres to its junction with footpath 25 at Point B4 on the map to a line running from Point A in a generally easterly direction for some 68 metres to Point B at the junction of the rear boundary fences of 129 and 131 Leander Drive and footpath 25
- (ii) Divert that part of footpath 27 running from Point A in a generally southeasterly direction for some 148 metres to its intersection with footpath 25 at Point C1 on the map to a line running from Point A in a generally easterly direction for some 32 metres to Point B1 then via the made up roadside footpath in a generally southerly direction for some 125 metres to point B3 then alongside the boundary of 159 Leander Drive in a generally easterly direction for some 52 metres to point C at the intersection of footpath 25 and Trows Lane.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Secretary's Department (Information Office) Town Hall, Rochdale during normal office hours.

This order becomes operative as from the date on which it is certified by Rochdale Borough Council that the new footpaths have been satisfactorily provided but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the order, he may under Section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 within 6 weeks from 15th April 1978 make application for the purpose to the High Court.—Dated 12th April 1978.

NORTH WILTSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971 - SECTION 210
*(Footpaths Nos. 78, 80 and 131, Lydiard Millicent)
Public Path Diversion Order 1978*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as the "Order") made on 7th April 1978 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the North Wiltshire District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the footpath system running north westwards from field ordnance Survey No. 0077 to Chestnut Springs to accommodate housing development known as The Mews. Lengths of Footpath 78 (16 yards), Footpath 80 (83 yards) and Footpath 131 (61 yards) will be closed and a new path will be created running from a stile in the field before mentioned north westwards between two house plots for 27 yards and in a generally westward direction on estate footways for 133 yards.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of the North Wiltshire District

Council, Monkton Park, Chippenham, Wiltshire and at the Sub-Office of the North Wiltshire District Council, Manor House, Wootton Bassett, Swindon, Wiltshire and may be inspected free of charge at these premises during the hours of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

Any representation or objection with respect to the order may be sent in writing to the District Secretary of the North Wiltshire District Council, Monkton Park, Chippenham, Wiltshire, not later than 15th May 1978 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn the North Wiltshire District Council may, instead of submitting the order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the order as an unopposed order. If the order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment with the order.—Dated 13th April 1978.
