closely monitored. It will remain in force for an initial period of 6 months but at the discretion of the Council it can be extended to a maximum life of 18 months and may be revoked or relaxed.

 - (v) invalid carriages as defined in Section 99 (5) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967,
 - (vi) Post Office pedestrian controlled electric trucks; and
- (b) the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 include:
 - (i) goods vehicles being used for the delivery or collection of goods or merchandise to the shops and premises fronting the said length of road which do not have a rear service or other facility available at the time of delivery or collection,
 - (ii) vehicles specifically designed or adapted for the transport of quantities of cash or other items of high value delivering or collecting the same to or from any bank premises fronting the said length of
 - (iii) vehicle requiring access to or egress from the shops and premises fronting the said length of road between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. whose owners park their vehicles on their own premises and an exemption notice is displayed in accordance with this exemption inside the windscreen of the vehicle concerned,
 - (iv) emergency service vehicles,
 - (v) vehicles being used in connection with building operations, demolition or road works, and which cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road,
 - (vi) vehicles requiring access to or egress from the shops and premises fronting the said length of road between the hours of 5 p.m. and 9 a.m.,
 - (vii) invalid carriages as defined in Section 99 (5) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967,
 - (viii) disabled person's vehicles which display in the relevant position a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority to the driver thereon in pursuance of a scheme under Section 21 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970,
 - (ix) Post Office pedestrian controlled electric trucks.
