Section 66, subsection (1) enables the local authority to serve a noise reduction notice on the person responsible for noise emanating from premises within a noise abatement area where it appears to the authority that the level of noise is not acceptable and that a reduction is practicable at reasonable cost and would afford a public benefit. Subsection (8) of that section provides that a person who without reasonable excuse contravenes a noise reduction notice is to be guilty of an offence against Part 3 of the said Act.
