### HYNDBURN BOROUGH COUNCIL

*The Borough of Hynburn (No. 1) Smoke Control Variation Order, 1978*

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of Hyndburn, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act, 1956, on 18th April 1978, made the above-mentioned Smoke Control Variation Order, which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment, for confirmation. The effect of the Order is to apply the provisions of section 11 of the Act to the buildings listed in the Schedule hereto, in accordance with the Borough of Accrington (No. 10) Smoke Control Order, 1970.

Subject to the limitations and exemptions provided by this Order and by virtue of section 11(4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £100 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before such date as may be determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

A copy of the Order may be inspected, free of charge at my offices in the Municipal Offices, St. James Street, Accrington, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from 1st May 1978.
