PRIVY COUNCIL OFFICE

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Secretary of State for the Environment that burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in St. Mary the Virgin's Churchyard, Bruton, in the County of Somerset, has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 21st day of December 1977, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853 (1853 c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith in St. Mary the Virgin's Churchyard, Bruton, in the county of Somerset, shown crosshatched on the plan annexed hereto.

Provided that—

(a) in any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the conditions that human remains are not disturbed and that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave, and

(b) burials may be allowed to continue in the used portion of the said Churchyard which formed the path running between the two entrances to the Churchyard and also, in land adjoining the Eastern boundary wall, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited at the Burial Grounds (St. Mary the Virgin's Churchyard, Bruton, Somerset) Order 1978.
