





The Trunk Road (Chester Road, Gresford) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 197

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales Proposes to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit waiting at any time on the sides of road specified in the Schedule to this Notice.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as it may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building, industrial or demolition operation; the removal of any obstruction to traffic, or the maintenance of the road or the service therein; or to enable the vehicle to be used in the service of a local or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

Exceptions will also be provided in the Order to enable vehicles bearing both a disabled persons badge and a parking disc to wait on the sides of road specified in the Schedule to this Notice, for a period not exceeding two hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of road).
