

- 59. Declaring redundant the church of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Emborough, a chapel of ease in the parish of Chewton Mendip with Emborough, in the diocese of Bath and Wells.
- 60. Uniting the benefices of Puriton and Pawlett, in the diocese of Bath and Wells.
- 61. Uniting the benefices of Barford; Wasperton; and Sherbourne, in the diocese of Coventry.
- 62. Uniting the benefices and parishes of Halstead; and Holy Trinity, Halstead, in the diocese of Chelmsford, and altering the areas of the new parish and the parish of Greenstead Green.
- 63. Revoking an earlier redundancy Scheme and appropriating the redundant part of the church of Saint Thomas a Becket, Pensford, in the diocese of Bath and Wells, to use as a monument and for cultural and community purposes and for purposes ancillary thereto and empowering the Bath and Wells Diocesan Board of Finance to lease the said part for such uses.
- 64. Appropriating the redundant parish church of the former parish of Hawerby-cum-Beesby, in the diocese of Lincoln, and the land annexed or belonging thereto, to use as a monument and for occasional use as an art gallery and for purposes ancillary thereto and empowering the said Commissioners to sell the said building and land for such uses.
- 65. Uniting the benefices of Helpringham; Hale Magna with Hale Parva; Screddington; and Swaton with Spanby, in the diocese of Lincoln.

- 66. (1) Uniting the benefices and parishes of Saint Martin of Tours with Holy Cross, Basildon and Saint Nicholas Laindon; Nevendon; and Dunton Waylett, (2) establishing a team ministry for the area of the new benefice, and (3) altering the areas of the parishes of Saint Martin of Tours with Holy Cross, Basildon and Saint Nicholas, Laindon; Saint Andrew, Basildon; Nevendon; Dunton Waylett; Fobbing; Vange; Pitsea; Langdon Hills; and Wickford, in the diocese of Chelmsford.
- 67. Uniting the benefices of Rearsby with Ratcliffe; and Thrussington, in the diocese of Leicester, and altering the name of the parish of Ratcliffe on the Wreake.
- 68. Creating a new benefice of Rushbrook and altering the name of the benefice of Bradfield Saint George with Rushbrooke, in the diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
- 69. Uniting the benefices of All Saints, Tibberton; Kinnersley; and Preston Wealdmoors, in the diocese of Lichfield.
- 70. Uniting the benefices of Hartington; and Biggin, in the diocese of Derby.
- 71. Providing for the Redundant Churches Fund to be responsible for the care and maintenance of the redundant parish church of the former parish of Chislehampton, in the diocese of Oxford.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Secretary of State for the Environment that burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in St. Michael's Churchyard, Willington, in the County of Derbyshire, shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto, has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 21st day of March 1978, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853 (1853 c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling,

is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith in St. Michael's Churchyard, Willington, in the County of Derbyshire, shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

Provided that in any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

- 2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (St. Michael's Churchyard, Willington, Derbyshire) Order 1978.
