NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971—SECTION 210

The West Derbyshire District Council (Public Footpath No. 43) at Bonsall, Matlock, Public Path Diversion Order 1978.

Notice is hereby given that the above mentioned Order made on 25th July 1978, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the West Derbyshire District Council.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to divert that part of Public Footpath No. 43 at present commencing at Grid Reference 27715857 (a point approximately 20 metres from the path's junction with High Street and adjacent to Town Head Farm) and extending generally northwards for 54 metres or thereabouts to Pounders Lane, opposite Manor Farm to a new line: commencing at the aforementioned point, Grid Reference 27715857 and extending north eastwards for a distance of approximately 4 metres then generally northwards for a distance of approximately 52 metres to Pounder Lane at Grid Reference 27735863 (a point approximately 8 metres east of the existing access to Pounder Lane).

Copies of the Order and the map contained in it have been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the District Council Offices at Matlock, Bakewell, Ashbourne and Wirksworth between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.

Any representations or objections with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Director of Administration, Town Hall, Matlock, not later than 3rd September 1978 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the West Derbyshire District

Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

The Eden District Council (Myers) Public Path Diversion (No. 1) Order 1978

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to vary the line of the public footpath numbered 113012 on the Definitive Map, which runs from the junction of the railway and motorway (M.6) embankments in a north west direction for a distance of approximately 150 yards thence north east for a distance of approximately 150 yards to the point where the north-east boundary of O.S. Plot No. 7949 meets the existing footpath, to a line running from the junction of the railway and motorway embankments in a north east direction along the boundary between O.S. Plot No. 7949 and the railway for a distance of approximately 315 yards, thence in a north westerly direction along the boundary between O.S. Plot No. 7949 and Plot No. 9367 for a distance of approximately 180 yards to the point where the north eastern boundary of O.S. Plot No. 7949 meets the existing footpath.

This Order becomes operative as from 5th August, 1978, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may, under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within 6 weeks from 5th August, 1978, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

MACCLESFIELD BOROUGH COUNCIL

Macclesfield High Street Conservation Area
