Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853 (1853 c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it

is hereby ordered, as follows:


1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith in All Saints' Churchyard, Moulton, in the County of Lincolnshire, shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

Provided that in the said Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds All Saints' Churchyard, Moulton, Lincolnshire Order 1978.
