THIS Day, by Her Majesty's Command, Sir Christopher Mugrave, Bart. was Sworn one of the Clerks of Her Majesty's most Honourable Privy-Council in Ordinary, in the Room, and upon the Voluntary Resignation, of Christopher Mugrave, Esq;

Turin, October 22. N. S. The Differences between this Court, and that of Rome, upon the Account of the Nomination to Ecclesiastical Benefices in Piedmont, continue on the same foot, without any prospect of a speedy Accommodation. The Bishop of Ventimiglia, a Genoise by Birth, hath been Commissioned by the Pope to treat with his Royal Highness on that Affair, and several Conferences have been accordingly held in relation to it; but this Court seem resolved not to recede from their Demands, and his Holiness cannot be persuaded to consent to Innovations so apparently prejudicial to the Papal Authority. The Imperial General Count Thaur, who hath been ill of the Gout, arrived here the 19th Instant, and the Day following the Court removed to the Venerie, where his Royal Highness proposeth to reside all the Winter. Upon an Information; that several Waggon's belonging to the Imperial Troops had brought great quantities of Contraband Goods into this City, the same were seized by the Duke's Order, and Sold publicly to the highest Bidder. On the 20th Instant the Army of the Allies broke up from Oulx, and began to March towards the Valley of Susa, having left behind them a sufficient Strength for the Security of the Frontiers. The Disposition of his Royal Highness's Cavalry in their several Quarters will be such, that they may be able at five Days warning to assemble, and form themselves into a Body upon Occasion. The Imperial Cavalry is to stay at Pancalier and Lambriaico, 'till the return of the Count d'Harach with the Repartition of the Winter Quarters from Vienna. The Marquis de Parelle, a Lieutenant-General in his Royal Highness's Service, died lately at a Seat he had near this City. The Imperial Commissary at Genoa proposeth to insist not only upon the Payment of the Arrears due from the Imperial Fiefs, but likewise to exact new Contributions. They write from Naples, that a Neapolitan Ship had lately taken three French Tartans, and carried them into Reggio; and that three French Men of War and two Privateers were Cruising in the Channel of Messina, with a design to intercept a Fleet laden with Corn and Oyl, expected from Apulia.

Brussels, November 3. N. S. The States of Brabant and Flanders have agreed to the Extraordinary Subsidies for the Substantance of the Imperial and Palatine Forces this Winter. The Baron de Renswoude and Monsieur Vandenberg, the States-Deputies to this Place, are gone from hence to the

Hague. They write from St. Amand, that at the Election of the Cardinal de Bouillon to be the Abbot of that Place, which was made on the 24th of the last Month, the Prior, and those in his Interest, vigorously opposed the Cardinal's Election, and menaced him and his Adherents with the Resentments of the French Court on that Occasion. Our Letters from Vienna of the 25th of October tell us, that the Counts de Schlick and Herberstein were returned thither from Hainbourg in Hungary, whither they had been sent by the Emperor to settle the Winter Quarters for the Imperial Forces in that Kingdom. These Letters add, that Adam Paiock, a Colonel of the Malecontents, had quitted that Party, and was come to Gran with one hundred of his Followers, in order to return to his Allegiance, and submit himself to his Imperial Majesty; and they are not without hopes of seeing his Example followed by other leading Men in that Kingdom. General Tiesenhausen, a Swede, that hath been a considerable time in the French King's Service, has been Arrésted at Harbourg by the Emperor's Orders, as he was returning into Sweden. Our Letters from Saxony tell us, that it appears by an exact Computation, that upwards of twenty five thousand Persons had been carried off by the Contagion in the space of three Months at Wilna. It ceaseth there at present, and is much abated in most of the Provinces in the Upper Poland and Lithuania, but beginneth to break out afresh in the Polish Russia. The Army of Lithuania have renewed their Oath of Fidelity to his Polish Majesty, the Republick, and the Great Marshal of that Dutchy. Monsieur Wollowicz being appointed the King of Poland's Ambassador to the Czar of Muscovy, is upon his Departure from Wilna to Petersbourg, where he is to reside in that Quality. They write from Frankfort of the 2d Instant, that the Bishop of Wurtzbourg arrived there the 30th of the last Month, in his way to Mayence, where he is to assist at the Election of a Coadjutor to that Archbishoprick, which is to be on the 6th of this Month, and it is still generally believed the Choice will fall on the Great Master of the Teutonick Order. The Forces of the Empire continue in their former situation at Rhin-Zabern, but they expect Orders for marching into Winter Quarters in three or four Days time. Letters from Cogn of the 4th Instant advise, that the Parties from both Armies continuing to harass that Elestorate, the Inhabitants had desired the Great Chapter to enter upon such Measures as might put a stop to those Practices for the future, declaring at the same time, that they should otherwise be unable to pay the Contributions exacted from them by the French, and those they were obliged to furnish to the Prussians. Our Letters from France tell us the Elektor of Bavaria was speedily expected at Court, where he was to solicit for Money for the recruiting his Forces; and when he has obtained it, he is to return to Namur, to give the necessary Orders for the raising his Recruits accordingly. The Council have daily under their Consideration the Means to raise the necessary Sums

Sums for the Support of the War. The King hath given Orders for augmenting his Foot, against the next Campaign, to fifty Men in a Company. They give out at Court, that the Duke of Anjou had commanded several Posts on the Sabor to be Fortified, which would prove of great Advantage to him in the Course of the War, and had ordered his Foot to March to a Place called Casa Tejada, eight Leagues from Placentia, which they did on the 17th of October, the Duke himself intending speedily to follow with the Cavalry, which was to be cantoned in the Neighbourhood of that Place.

Bristol, October 28. Yesterday came in the Anne Galley of this Place, Benjamin Rumfey Master, in five Weeks from Newfoundland, but last from Ireland; and the Corfely Galley of Bristol, Patrick Toomy Master, from Venice and Zant, but last from Ireland. The same Tide came in the Ambuscade Frigate, a Prize taken by two Gallies belonging to this Place; the mounts twenty four Guns, and was formerly an East-India Man called the Trumball. The Tyger Frigate of this Port sailed this Day for Cork and Jamaica.

Plymouth, October 29. Yesterday came back by contrary Winds from the Eastward, the Dutch Man of War and Fleet which sailed the 25th. The same Day came in the America from Curaco, and the Zealand Galley from Barbary, both for Zealand; together with the Barnaby Galley of London, who to the Westward fought a Dunkirk Privateer of sixteen Guns; after a sharp Dispute the Privateer left him. The next Day he was taken by a Dunkirk Privateer of thirty Guns: Captain Barnaby is on Board the Privateer, he had one Man killed, one wounded, and the Ship was retaken and sent in by the White Phoenix Privateer of Flushing. This Day came in the Unity of Stockholm from Lisbon, and the three Kings of Ostend with Hops for Ireland.

Falmouth, October 30. On the 28th the King William Packet-boat failed; and yesterday came in four Doggers from Dublin, laden with Butter, bound to Ostend. The other Ships bound to the Eastward continue here.

Tarmouth, November 1. This Day came in the Robert and Nathaniel of London, to lade Herrings for the Streights; as did also divers light Colliers, several of which belonging to this Place are come into Haven, to lye up during the Winter.
