PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Secretary of State for the Environment that burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in Holy Sepulchre Churchyard, Ashington, in the County of Northumberland, shown hatched and cross-hatched on the plan annexed hereto, has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 25th day of July 1978, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853 (c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased,

by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

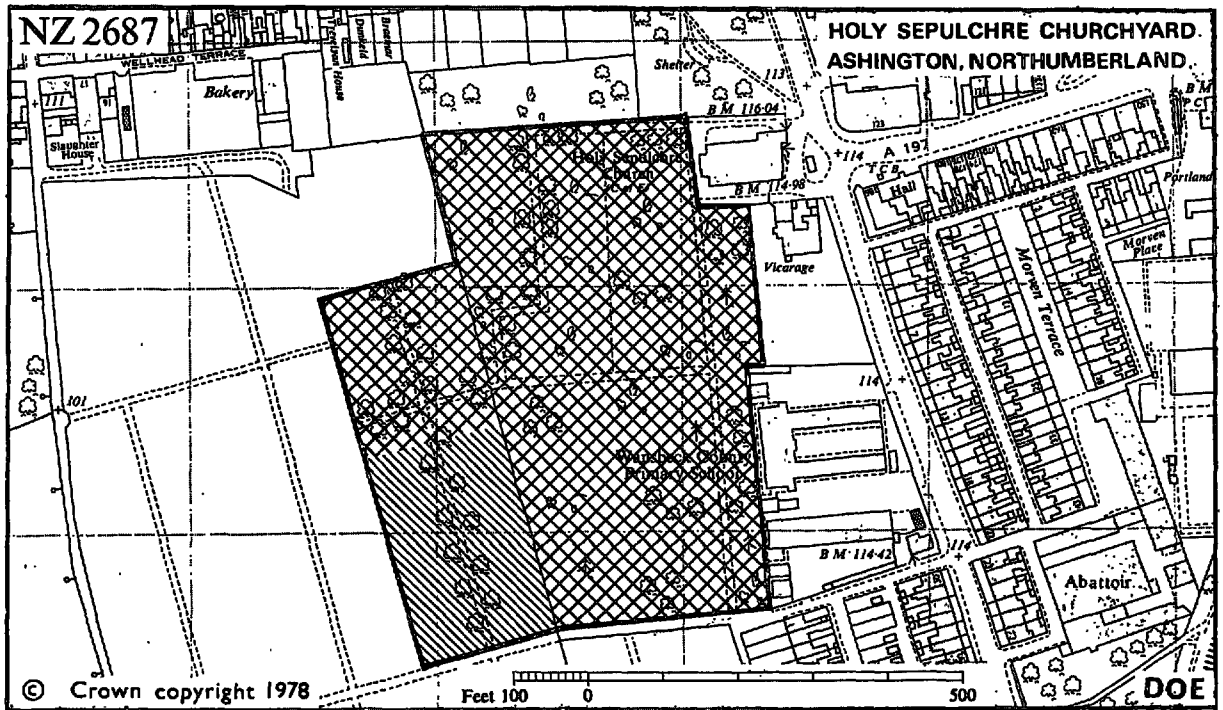
1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith in Holy Sepulchre Churchyard, Ashington, in the County of Northumberland, shown hatched and cross-hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

Provided that in any earthen grave now existing in the area shown cross-hatched on the said plan of the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Holy Sepulchre Churchyard, Ashington, Northumberland) Order 1978.

CERTIFICATES OF TAX DEPOSIT

In accordance with paragraph 5 of the Prospectus (Series 3) dated 29th August 1978, the Treasury hereby gives notice that, on and from 16th October 1978, the rate of interest on deposits accepted under the terms of the Prospectus and applied in payment of tax will be 10½ per cent. per annum, and the rate of interest on deposits withdrawn for cash will be 8½ per cent. per annum. RATES OF INTEREST ON LOANS FROM THE NATIONAL LOANS FUND

NOTICE

The Treasury in pursuance of section 5 of the National Loans Act 1968 hereby give notice that on or after 14th October 1978:

- I. Different rates of interest shall apply according to whether the principal of a loan is repaid by instalments or at maturity and, if repaid by instalments, whether by equal instalments of the principal with interest paid on the decreasing balance of the principal (E.I.P.), or by instalments of equal repayments of the principal and interest paid thereon (E.R.);
- II. The lowest rates of interest satisfying the conditions laid down in subsection (2) of the said section 5 shall be—
