

Falmouth, November 3. The *Mercury Packet-boat* is arrived in nine Days from Lisbon. On the 5th Instant in the Night they met with a Fleet which they suppose to be the Turkey Fleet; about two hundred Leagues to the Westward.

Plimouth, November 10. Yesterday arrived the *St. Peter* from Bilbao for Amsterdam. This Day failed the *Hope* for Dran.

Tarmouth, November 10. Several laden Colliers are come into this Road from the Northward. The Resolution Gally of London bound for Leghorn has been forced back by contrary Winds, and continues here with the Robert and Nathaniel bound to the same Port.
