ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

BLACKBURN BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Blackburn Borough Council (Altom Street and Kendal Street) (Experimental Prohibition of Driving) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that on 16th January 1979 the Blackburn Borough Council, pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the County Council of Lancashire, in exercise of the powers of the said County Council, made the above Order under sections 9 and 69 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, the effect of which will be to prohibit the driving of motor vehicles in the lengths of road set out in the Schedule to this notice, for an experimental period of six months.

This Order, which will come into operation on 22nd January 1979, together with the appropriate map, may be examined at my office during normal office hours and may be challenged in the High Court within 6 weeks from the date on which it was made.

The Blackburn Borough Council (Northgate) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1978 (Amendment) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that on 16th January 1979 the Blackburn Borough Council, pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the County Council of Lancashire, in exercise of the powers of the said County Council, made the above Order under section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 the effect of which will be to delete the word "motor" from Article 3 of the Borough of Blackburn (Northgate) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1978.

BUCKINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The Buckinghamshire County Council (Various Roads, High Wycombe) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Loading) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that the Buckinghamshire County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1(1), (2), (3) and 84D(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, Schedule 19 of the Local Government Act, 1972, and Schedule 6 of the Road Traffic Act, 1974, the effect of which Order will be—

1. To prohibit any person from causing or permitting any vehicle to wait ;

(a) at any time on any day in certain lengths of Hughenden Road, Coates Lane, Kitchener Road, Baker Street, Queen Street, Peterborough Avenue, Bridge Street, Queen Alexandra Road, Suffield Road, Rutland Street, Marlow Hill, London Road, Desborough Road, Abbey Barn Road, Priory Road, Malmers Well Road, The Pastures, Pinnions Road, Alexandra Road, Corporation Street, High Street, Dovecot Road and Shaftesbury Street ;

(b) at any time between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Mondays to Saturdays in certain lengths of Richardson Street, Oakridge Road, Baker Street, Brook Street, Denmark Street, Priory Road, Greenway, Toteridge Avenue, Hamilton Road, Roberts Road, Pinnions Road, London Road, Desborough Road, Victoria Street, Cedar Terrace, Brook Street, Hughenden Road, Lucas Road, Rectory Avenue, Queen Alexandra Road, Loakes Road, Grafton Street ;

(c) between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Mondays to Saturdays for a period exceeding two hours with return prohibited within two hours in certain lengths of Baker Street and Brook Street ;

2. To prohibit any person from causing or permitting any vehicle to wait for the purpose of loading or unloading between the hours of 8 a.m. to 9.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. to 6 p.m. Mondays to Saturdays in a certain length of Frogmoor.

Exemptions to the proposed Order will permit the following:

1. Waiting with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden.

2. Waiting for so long as may be necessary:

(a) for persons to board or alight ;

(b) for goods to be loaded or unloaded with the exception of the length of road referred to in item 2 above ;

(c) for enabling works to be carried out ;

(d) in pursuance of statutory powers or duties ; and

3. The waiting of disabled persons' vehicles in accordance with the "Orange Badge" Scheme.

The Order will provide for the variation of the following Orders so far as is necessary to implement these proposals:

The Buckinghamshire County Council (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (High Wycombe) (No. 1) Order 1975.

The Buckinghamshire County Council (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (High Wycombe) (No. 2) Order 1975.

The Department of the Environment Order 1974 No. 891 (Schedule 2).
